For school-age piano students at 'Glenfern', 417 Inkerman St, East St Kilda

Two 2-day workshops of piano classes and individual lessons

With distinguished teaching, this holiday music programme takes place in the 19th-century heritage National Trust mansion 'Glenfern', in East St Kilda. It is designed to help piano students from ages 6 to 18 achieve their potential, irrespective of their level or background. The young pianists work intensively over two days to consolidate their musical and pianistic skills, to polish their repertoire pieces, to prepare for competitions as well as for AMEB, ANZCA, VCE and other examinations. Spring Piano School provides also an enjoyable social opportunity for school-age piano students. Students attend either the Junior or the Senior Programme.

Junior Programme

Tuesday September 27 & Wednesday September 28, 9.30am - 4.30pm

*Approximately 20 places for primary school students of all music exam level,
plus Year 7 students up to and including AMEB/ANZCA grade 4 level*

Senior Programme

Thursday September 29 & Friday September 30, 9.30am - 5.00pm

Approximately 15 places for secondary school students of all music exam levels

Junior Programme

Normally students should have experienced a minimum of 2 years' individual piano tuition. The programme assumes that students will attend independently, however parents who wish to enrol as paid observers may do so. Junior Programme participants should bring 3 – 5 works prepared to a secure standard. Year 7 students at AMEB/ANZCA Grade 4 level or below should attend the Junior Programme. In the group classes, the students will have the opportunity to hear others performing and will gain experience in playing before others. They will have individual lessons also. The Junior Programme will conclude with a public recital for friends and family members, including a scholarship presentation. Morning and afternoon teas are provided, however students should bring their own lunch and a drink.

Senior Programme

Senior Programme participants will work with distinguished tutors and experience a range of teaching styles. The programme assumes that students will attend independently, however parents who wish to enrol as paid observers may do so. The group lessons will encompass skills development and interpretation of repertoire, whilst the individual lessons will provide intensive teaching and coaching, all helping to provide each student with ideas and techniques to take their performance to the next level. This programme provides ideal preparation for upcoming exams and recitals. The Senior Programme will conclude with a public recital for friends and family members, including a scholarship presentation. Participants in the Senior Programme should bring 3 - 4 works prepared to a secure standard. Morning and afternoon teas are provided, however students should bring their own lunch and a drink.

Scholarships

Scholarships funded by the *Friends of the Team of Pianists Inc. The number of Scholarships is limited. Those selected for scholarships will receive, at the conclusion of the school, a refund of part of their tuition fee. Scholarships may be awarded on the basis of helping with travel expenses, need, ability, encouragement, possibly also on recommendation from the student's teacher.

Some evaluations from the Spring Piano School 2015

Different people playing different kinds of music helped me understand how techniques and accents were appropriate for each kind of music. Also, some of the teachers asked the audience lots of questions, rather than just asking the person who was playing, which made sure that we were concentrating and fully understood the kind of music being played.

It was interesting to receive various opinions on the same piece, as each piece was heard by a few different teachers. We looked at different methods of practice. Various teachers offered different approaches and this helped my playing. It was valuable to gain actual performance experience playing in front of others. I valued being able to work in a small group and the School was fast-paced and engaging.

I felt happy because I learnt new things and performed well in all repertoire pieces. I was also delighted to receive the scholarship from the Friends of the Team of Pianists.
