The Team's Spring Piano School is designed to help piano students from ages 6 to 18 achieve their potential, regardless of their level or background.

With world-class teaching, this 21st century holiday program takes place in the 19th century Gothic National Trust mansion Glenfern, in East St Kilda. The young pianists work intensively to consolidate their musical and pianistic skills, polish their repertoire pieces and also socialise with their musical peers

The Spring Piano School 2013 is a wonderful school holiday preparation for AMEB, ANZCA, VCE and other examinations, as well as for competitions. It is a valued social and educational opportunity for piano students. Students attend either the Junior Program or the Senior Program.

... Approximately 15 places for secondary school students including Year 7 students at ANZCA/AMEB Grade 5 level and above

Senior Program participants will work with distinguished tutors in small groups, thereby experiencing a range of teaching styles. Some workshops and group lessons will be based around skills development, while others will concentrate purely on repertoire, with Intensive teaching and coaching. The aim is to provide each student with ideas and techniques to take their performance to the next level. This program is ideal preparation for upcoming exams and recitals.

The senior program will conclude with a public recital for friends and family members, including a scholarship presentation.

Participants in the senior program should bring 3 - 4 works prepared to a secure standard. Morning and afternoon tea are provided, however students should bring their own lunch and a drink.

About our Guest Teachers

Peter Hurley has been involved in primary, secondary and tertiary music programs as a teacher, assessor and curriculum developer for over 25 years. He is currently lecturer in Aural Studies and Topics in Musicology – Music Theatre and Cabaret at the University of Melbourne. He has also lectured at the VCA, Box Hill Institute, Melba Memorial Conservatorium, the VMTA, and the Suzuki Talent Education Association and is currently engaged in post graduate research in audio cognition, specifically relating to pitch and memory. Peter Hurley performs regularly around Australia in many different guises - for the A.B.C., with the State Orchestra of Victoria, as a classical musician with the late pianist Nehama Patkin, and with children's entertainer Franciscus Henri. He is renowned as a teacher of improvisation and popular styles and will work to develop the children's musical creativity in Spring Piano School 2013.

Marie Cull's students have consistently achieved outstanding results in exams and competitions. In 2012 Marie won the AMEB Teaching Shield for "Piano Preliminary to 6th Grade" for 2012, awarded annually to the teacher who achieves the best exam results throughout the ACT and NSW. Marie gained her Bachelor of Music from the Canberra School of Music in 1987, having studied for four years with John Luxton, and with the Hungarian pianist Peter Nagy. She was based in Vienna for more than a decade, enjoying the inspirational teaching of Sally Sargent, a student of Marcel Ciampi and Nadia

Boulanger. Since her return to Canberra in 2000, Marie has been teaching at the ANU School of Music and has established a very successful private teaching studio.

Kevin Kanisius Suherman was born in Bandung, Indonesia and started learning classical piano when he was 6 yrs old, as well as learning pop and jazz styles. In 2008 he entered Melbourne Grammar School with a music and school scholarship, where he studied piano with Professor Max Cooke, was music captain and a prefect, as well as leader of the first violins as concertmaster of the MGSSO. In 2013 he commenced his Bachelor of Music studies at the Melbourne Conservatorium of Music with Max Cooke. He has performed concertos in Indonesia, Australia, Paris and Japan, and released two CD's on the Schimmel Artist Collection label. He has had lessons and masterclasses in Europe with Professors Kämmerling, Andrea Bonatta and Paul Badura-Skoda.
