

BLOCKBUSTER, OR SMASHING IT ON PIANO

Team of Pianists' latest 2023 event details and plans for 2024

C&C RIGG BEQUEST CLASSIC MUSIC IN HISTORIC VENUES 2023-2024

Britten and Bonis at Barwon Park

Sunday 19 November 2023 at 2.00pm **'Barwon Park'** 105 Inverleigh Road, Winchelsea, VIC. 3241

Benjamin Britten's all-too-rarely heard cycle of eight songs from 1953, Winter Words was set to some of the last poems written by Victorian English poet Thomas Hardy and is remarkable for its clarity of text.

This recital in the National Trust's Barwon Park mansion (built by Thomas and Elizabeth Austin in 1871) allows listeners to experience Britten's original tenor setting in elegant and intimate surrounds, performed by tenor Michael Petruccelli and accompanied by **Darryl Coote**.

Compositions by the late Romantic French composer Mel Bonis have become better known in recent years. Her four-movement Sonata for flute and piano, with its lyrical beautry and excellent structural balance, will be performed by the Principal Flute of Orchestra Victoria Lisa-Maree Amos with Darryl Coote at the piano.

Also on the programme are two shorter works for flute and piano, including Road Trip by Australian composer Sally Whitewell, inspired by commuting to work on a train. Darryl Coote's performance of Schubert's Impromptu No. 1 in C minor, Op. 90 will round out the recital.

REPORTING FROM EARLY 2023

The 'Darryl Hits 60' concert on 1 May was a partying success. Darryl was worked very hard for his birthday on that piano, accompanying separately an oboe, a cello and a mezzo-soprano with a program of pieces. He survived, and has been seen since with an 'I'd do it all again' expression, when asked did he enjoy it?

Regarding the 2024 part of the *Rigg Bequest Classic Music in Historic Venues 2023-2024 Series*, some dates are set, but details are still to be 'played out!'

- Sunday 21 April 2024 2pm at Como, (two performances of the same program at 2pm and at 4pm, Robert Chamberlain piano, Vivien Hamilton mezzosoprano, plus one more guest artist with FOTOPS to serve refreshments on the eastern verandah for both concerts), and
- Sunday 26 May at Labassa, (again two performances of two programs in two different rooms, with audience moving to the other room at interval Robert Chamberlain, Roman Ponomariov horn, Judith Dodsworth soprano as one of the recitals, Darryl Coote with guest artist as the other recital),

INTERVIEW: AN ACTOR AMONG MUSICIANS

Mr Ed has interview musicians who don't touch piano, singers and promoters, but this is a first conversation with an actor. Caroline Craig has agreed to be narrator in the coming Team of Pianists 'Blockbuster 2' concert. She will narrate the story of 'Carnival of the Animals'. Caroline is well known for TV roles including 'Blue Heelers' and 'Underbelly', and in films, and for appearing in stage productions across Australia. The Team are pleased she has come back from New York to include our Rippon Lea concert in her itinerary. Caroline, thank you for agreeing to be interviewed for the FOTOPS Newsletter:

Mr.Ed: Were you ever trained in or tempted by the piano or another instrument?

Caroline: YES. I learnt piano, violin and music theory as a child. I went up to AMEB Grade 6 on violin and kept up the music theory when I did singing for VCE music. I auditioned for the Conservatorium at Melbourne University, but finished a BA ACTING at NIDA in Sydney instead. I sang in a band at University and sang in my last theatre show – Starfish the [Redacted] - that just closed at La Mama last week. Music has been a huge part of my life. We have my great aunt's baby grand piano at home, my husband and I play and now my girls learn. My great aunt was a strict but brilliant bel Canto teacher. She and my grandmother were great inspirations to me musically. Every day after school, my grandmother would play the piano and we would dance and sing and play. A piano is the heart of a happy home.

Mr.Ed: How and when did you first meet the members of the Team of Pianists?

Caroline: I met Darryl Coote through my stepfather Professor Anthony Buzzard, who belongs to The Boobooks, a Melbourne University Alumni organization, who share ideas over dinners once a month. Darryl and I are distantly related - both my great aunt Libby and Marjorie my grandma - musical mentors - were Cootes. I'm hoping the pianist DNA will carry through to my girls as they learn to play.

Mr.Ed: What has been your favourite role in your career to date?

Caroline: I played Matron Grace Wilson in an ABC TV series Anzac Girls about the nurses who cared for the wounded at Gallipoli. She was an incredibly strong leader and a kind and brave woman, who lost her brother in the war and made huge progress for women in medicine. There are retired nurses today who still talk about what a huge heart Grace had, and the working conditions and retirement homes that she put in place for women who served in war. I feel so privileged to play such a trailblazing woman and unsung heroine. There are so many more stories. I'm sure a spin off series is overdue!

Mr.Ed: What part has music played in your work, in working with other musicians?

- Caroline: I love singing in all the shows I've been in, I worked with Iain Grandage, Tim Minchin, Eddie Perfect and many more brilliant composers. My first musical was 'Seven Little Australians' when I was twelve. I adore making new work and telling Australian stories through song.
- Mr.Ed: Having travelled, do you have a favourite venue?
 Caroline: I loved performing in the Traverse Theatre in Edinburg and the Opera House. My favourite is La Mama here in Carlton. There is so much history in those walls. Wonderful energy of live performance and the stories told, and yet to be told. Also performing in regional theatres where audiences are so alive and engaged. Wollongong and Canberra are favourites. Also Adelaide's Space Theatre in the Festival Centre has a warm intimate feeling. You can connect with audiences in a unique way.

Mr.Ed: Do you have a favourite composer or a piece of music, and why?

Caroline: That's a hard one. I am a big fan of many Australian composers. Tim Minchin's lyrics and speed and alacrity and humour always make me laugh, but Iain Grandage and Elena Kats-Chernin really connect with me right now when I'm in the veggie garden with the kids. I also love Chopin for the piano, and am enjoying a few Beethoven classics when I can find the time. Jason Beck-Gonzales is a pianist who really inspires my husband's playing. Tricky stuff, but fills the house with light and love!

Mr.Ed: What is your favourite ice cream?

Caroline: My favourite ice cream is hazelnut. You can never go wrong!


